One-year Post-doc position offer, at Telecom Paris (EU H2020 DIALLS project): interaction analysis and development of European values in schools

A one-year post-doc position is offered at Telecom Paris (<a href="https://www.telecom-paris.fr/">https://www.telecom-paris.fr/</a>), CNRS i3 laboratory (<a href="https://i3.cnrs.fr/">https://i3.cnrs.fr/</a>), within the framework of the DIALLS H2020 EU project (<a href="https://dialls2020.eu/">https://dialls2020.eu/</a>), from 1 May 2020 to 30 April 2021.

DIALLS ("Dialogue and Argumentation for cultural Literacy Learning in Schools") involves 7 European countries (coordinated by the University of Cambridge) in a three-year project working with schools to understand and develop how children and young people make sense of Europe and its differing cultures. A Cultural Literacy Learning Programme has been developed, within which students from primary and secondary schools engage in (face-to-face and computer-mediated) dialogue and argumentation around narrative picture books and videos, to co-elaborate meanings of values such as empathy, tolerance and diversity.

At this mid-point of the project, the research to be carried out by the recruited post-graduate researcher will principally involve development of methods for analysing interactions between students and coordinating feedback from users of the DIALLS Internet-based platform.

The post-doc researcher will work under the direction of Michael Baker (DR CNRS) and Françoise Détienne (DR CNRS), at Telecom Paris, in its new building situated at Palaiseau to the south of the Paris Region.

The position is open to researchers who have already been awarded the doctorate, or possibly have submitted their theses awaiting the viva examination. Salary is according to number of years of experience after the doctorate, according to CNRS salary scales.

Required skills and background are:

- previous research experience on analysis of verbal interactions,
- PhD in a social and human science discipline (with a preference for psychology, ergonomics or language sciences),
- ability to engage in collaborative research on an international level, and
- good written/spoken English language skills.

The preferred starting date is 1 May 2020 (or one month earlier, for a 13-month contract).
